1/2 Penny Sales Tax

Since 2003, Orange County Public Schools has opened 59 new schools to make room for growth and relieve overcrowding. Through the 2021-22 school year, 132 new schools have been renovated or replaced.

OCPS gets money from three sources to pay for school construction projects:

A local sales tax (paid anytime someone buys something in Orange County)

Impact fees (paid by builders)

Property taxes (paid by homeowners)

A half penny sales tax to pay for school construction was originally approved by Orange County voters in 2002. In 2014 voters decided to renew funding to continue much-needed renovations to Orange County schools. Because Central Florida attracts tourists from all over the world, visitors to Orange County pay 55% of the tax while our students benefit 100%.
