### <u>Independent Accountants' Report</u> <u>On Applying Agreed-Upon Procedures</u>

School Board of Orange County, Florida Orlando, Florida

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, which were agreed to by Orange County Public Schools (OCPS) (the specified party) on the billing, cash receipts, and attendance records of Central Florida Young Men's Christian Association, Inc. ("Central Florida YMCA" or "Provider") (the responsible party) relating to the outsourcing of the before and after school and full day service care programs for Orange County Public Schools from July 2019 through June 2020. Central Florida YMCA's management is responsible for the billing, cash receipts, and attendance records. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of OCPS. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

Our procedures and associated findings are as follows:

1.	Obtain the following documents from OCPS:  a. Copy of the contract between the School Board of Orange County, Florida and Central Florida YMCA.	Documents obtained without exception.	
	<ul> <li>b. Copies of the School Age Services Attendance and Revenue Report for 2019 – 2020 for the months of July 2019 through June 2020 for Central Florida YMCA for each school where the Provider operates a before and after school and full day service care program.</li> </ul>		
	c. Approved tuition and other fee schedule.		
2.	Haphazardly select a sample of three months and perform the following:	The three months selected were July 2019, January 2020, and March 2020	
	a. Obtain copies of daily attendance records from Central Florida YMCA.	a. All daily attendance records were obtained.	
	<ul> <li>b. Compare the number of students in attendance from the daily attendance records obtained in step 2a to the number of students in attendance as reported on the corresponding School Age Services Attendance and Revenue Report for 2019 – 2020 obtained in step 1b.</li> </ul>	b. See Exhibit A for the results of applying this procedure.	

Step	Procedure Description	Findings
3.	For each of the three months selected in step 2, haphazardly select 5 students from the daily attendance records obtained in step 2a for each school and perform the following:	
	a. Obtain billing and payment history reports for each student for that month.	a. Central Florida YMCA provided billings and payment history reports for each student selected.
	b. Compare the fee charged to the student for that month to the approved tuition and other fee schedule obtained in step 1c.	b. The fee charged to each sample student was the same amount as the fee in the approved tuition and other fee schedule other than the students noted in Exhibit B.
	c. For students whose tuition and fees were paid through a scholarship, examine the student's registration form for evidence of scholarship approval.	c. There were 44 students who received either a discount of fees or a scholarship. Central Florida YMCA does not document evidence of scholarship approval with a signature; however, a Financial Assistance Application is completed. Out of the 9 students who received a scholarship, 2 did not have a Financial Assistance Application.
	d. For students whose tuition and fees were paid through a grant, examine the grant document showing the selected student was included in the grant.	d. None of the selected students had tuition or fees paid through a grant.

4.	Perform the following procedures for each month from July 2019 through June 2020:	
	<ul> <li>a. Obtain a cash receipt report for each month for each school.</li> </ul>	a. Reports were not obtained. Central Florida YMCA stated that the report could not be generated from the software.
	<ul> <li>Compare the amount of cash receipts on the cash receipt report obtained in step 4a to the amount included as gross revenue from families on the School Age Services</li> </ul>	b. This step could not be performed because we were unable to obtain a cash receipt report, as noted in the findings for step 4a.
	Attendance and Revenue Report for 2019 – 2020 obtained in step 1b.	It should be noted that the gross revenue from families on the School Age Services Attendance and Revenue Report for 2019 – 2020 is revenue on an accrual basis (based on billings) and not on a cash basis.
5.	For each of the three months selected in step 2, trace all cash receipts from the cash receipt report obtained in step 4a to the corresponding bank statement.	Because bank deposits consist of a combination of amounts from the before and after school and full day service care programs for Orange County Public Schools and amounts from other programs and there was no report available to show the breakdown of deposits by program, we were unable to perform this procedure.
6.	Calculate the total gross cash receipts collected by Central Florida YMCA from individuals, third parties and on grants for the period of July 2019 through June 2020 by adding the totals from the monthly cash receipt reports obtained in step 4a.	This step could not be performed because we were unable to obtain a cash receipts report, as noted in the findings for step 4a.

7.	Perform the following procedures for each month from July 2019 through June 2020:	
	a. Obtain a report of revenue earned on the accrual basis for the after school and full day service care programs for Orange County Public Schools for the period of July 2019 through June 2020.	a. Obtained a report of billings for the period of July 2019 through June 2020.
	b. Compare the amount of revenue earned on the accrual basis on the report obtained in step 7a to the amount included as gross revenue from families on the School Age Services Attendance and Revenue Report for 2019 – 2020 obtained in step 1b.	b. See Exhibit C for the results of applying this procedure.
8.	Calculate the portion of funds earned by OCPS from July 2019 through June 2020 by multiplying 13% by the total gross cash receipts collected by the Central Florida YMCA from individuals and third parties in step 5 plus 3% of the total gross cash receipts collected by the Central Florida YMCA from grants in step 5 less any refunds given from the report of refunds granted obtained in step 4b.	This step could not be performed because we were unable to obtain a cash receipts report, as noted in the findings for step 4a.
9.	Calculate the portion of funds earned by OCPS from July 2019 through June 2020 by multiplying 13% by the total revenue earned on the accrual basis in step 7b plus 3% of the total revenue earned on the accrual basis from grants in step 7b.	See Exhibit D for the results of applying this procedure. There were no amounts received from grants.
10.	Calculate the portion of funds remitted to OCPS from July 2019 through June 2020 by adding the total remittance amount noted on the School Age Services Attendance and Revenue Report for 2019 – 2020 for the months of July 2019 through June 2020 obtained in step 1b.	See Exhibit D for the results of applying this procedure.

This agreed-upon procedures engagement was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. We were not engaged to and did not conduct an examination or review, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion or conclusion, respectively, on the billing, cash receipts, and attendance records. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion or conclusion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the management of Orange County Public Schools and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than the specified party.
