**TITLE:** Vocational Follow-up Survey

**POLICY:**

The superintendent shall determine the status of students who complete a technical program based on procedures described in the relevant Florida Statute and State Board of Education Rule 6A- 10.0341.

- (1) The procedure(s) used to collect data shall be selected by the superintendent after consultation with the associate superintendent for Career and Technical Education.
- (2) Data aggregated by the superintendent shall not contain personally identifiable information unless prior written approval is secured from the individual.

**TITLE:** Technical Entry-Level Examinations

**POLICY:**

- (1) The state-approved postsecondary technical program entry-level examinations shall be administered to all students who enroll in a postsecondary adult technical program consisting of 450 or more clock hours of instruction. These examinations shall be administered within the first six weeks after a student is admitted to the program.
- (2) Those students lacking the minimum level of basic skills shall be referred to an appropriate technical basic skills instructional program, which may include English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL).
- (3) Students shall not receive a certificate of program completion until they have demonstrated the mastery of the basic skills appropriate for the occupational program completed as provided by standards adopted by the state board of education.
- (4) Students classified as exceptional, pursuant to the relevant Florida Statute, are exempt from this rule.

- (5) Exceptional students, as defined in Section 1000.21, may be exempted from the entry-level examinations. A student who possesses an associate-of-arts, baccalaureate, or graduate-level degree; who has completed the college-level communication and computation skills examination pursuant to Section 1008.29; or who is exempt from the college entry-level examination pursuant to the relevant Florida Statute may be exempted from the entry-level examinations.
